GaLTT Activities Since Last POSAC Meeting:

May 18th. GaLTT Invasives Work Party – Drumbeg Provincial Park. 12 volunteers (18 volunteer hours) removed Scotch Broom from Peterson and Dorby roadsides.

May 21th. GaLTT Trails Work Party – Joyce Lockwood Regional Park / Kensington Lands. 7 volunteers (10.5 volunteer hours) Trail trimming on the full length of the cliff trail from Whalebone to the waterfall **and** a side path up to the Pequod trail.



May 25th. GaLTT Invasives Work Party – Drumbeg Provincial Park. 14 volunteers (22.25 volunteer hours) focused on removing Scotch Broom from the park.

May 28th. GaLTT Invasives Work Party – Petroglyth Way. 9 volunteers (12.5 volunteer hours) removed Scotch Broom from the roadside.

May 30th. GaLTT Native Plants Depot – (Located at the Gabriola Commons). Mosaic Forest Management donated hundreds of Western red cedar and Douglas fir seedlings to GaLTT and Gabriola Elementary School. The school students helped to pot the plants. The plants were made available free to any interested residents.



June 1st. GaLTT Invasives Work Party – Coast Road. 8 volunteers (12 volunteer hours) removed Scotch Broom from the roadside.

June 3rd. GaLTT Annual End-to-End Walk - 75 participants walked from Silva Bay to the Skol. This annual event is used to promote GaLTT's long established goal to have a recognized and dedicated trail from one end of the island to the other.



June 4th. GaLTT Trails Work Party – Keith Road ROW boardwalk installation. 19 volunteers (28 volunteer hours).

June 8th. GaLTT Invasives Work Party – Village Area and Ferry Hill. 13 volunteers (20 volunteer hours) removed Scotch Broom from the roadside.

June 24th. GaLTT Pollinator Workshop @ the Gabriola Commons – Pollinator expert, Erin Udal, lead a workshop where participants learned how to identify native bees and other pollinators of Gabriola Island.



This workshop helped participants to understand the needs and conditions of our wild pollinators so that we may protect and enhance habitat on Gabriola Island together.

Some of the tips Erin shared for land stewardship included keeping areas of our land undisturbed (no tilling or mulching) since mining bees make holes in hard packed bare land soil for egg laying.

Others nest in holes in fallen trees.

Native plants such as snowberry, gumweed and pearly everlasting have long bloom times and are valuable food sources for pollinators.

June 25th. GaLTT Invasives Work Party – Paisley Place. 9 volunteers (13.5 volunteer hours) removed Scotch Broom from the roadside.

July 9th. GaLTT Restoration Work Party – Queequeg Community Park. 5 volunteers (10 volunteer hours) Following significant daphne removal at this site in 2021, GaLTT volunteers planted native shrubs provided by the RDN. Work is continuing on restoration work by pulling small invasives to allow the native species to thrive.

June 30th. GaLTT Scotch Broom Removal Summary – This year, GaLTT's 11 broom work parties, generated 236 volunteer hours. The independent Band of Broom Brothers, who met on Thursdays for 8 weeks, worked another 83 hours and we know that many individuals, all over Gabriola have been working on their broom patches.

and a refuge for threatened species vulnerable to human disturbance, including the western screech owl, barn swallow, and great blue heron.

Earlier this month, GaLTT and other partners, visited Link Island to support the installation of Western Screech-Owl nest boxes. This site visit was organized by the Species at Risk Program Coordinator from the Islands Trust Conservancy (ITC) and included biologists and representatives from the ITC, Nanaimo Area Land Trust (NALT) and Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC).



GaLTT joined others in installing 8 nest boxes with Ren, the owl biologist, and removed the occasional invasive plant, like tansy ragwort and English holly.

September 13th. GaLTT Restoration Party – Drumbeg Provincial Park. A work party prepared for this fall's seeding and planting in the meadow restoration area. Firstly, the work party removed small broom plants that were popping up in some of the sites. 17 volunteers (26.5 volunteer hours).

September 17th. GaLTT Volunteer Appreciation Event – Queequeg Regional Park.



September 20th. GaLTT Restoration Party – Drumbeg Provincial Park. A work party prepared for repeat-seeding with native species. GaLTT's future planting of native annuals, perennials, and grasses will include yarrow donated by NALT and raised from seed by the Invasive Species Committee. 11 volunteers (14 volunteer hours).

GaLTT Information Table at the Agi Saturday Market

Camp Miriam Contribution to Conservation:

Every summer, Camp Miriam kids help GaLTT with conservation tasks like removing invasives.

This commitment is inspired by *tikkun olam* — Hebrew for "repairing the world" — and is demonstrated in the campers' efforts to make the world a better place while on Gabriola. Three groups of campers, ranging in age from 9 to 14, under GaLTT supervision, worked hard to remove invasive tansy ragwort and scotch broom this year.

GaLTT Fallen Tree Removals from Trails:

A large fallen branch cleared from the big Maple tree on the Jeanette trail in the 707 CP.

A large tree cleared from the Mallett Creek trail in Cox CP.

GaLTT and Conservation Covenant Monitoring:

Conservation is a long-term commitment. When a landholder puts a conservation covenant on their property, it is in perpetuity, helping ensure an ecosystem stays in a natural state. As a land trust, GaLTT is co-covenant holder of three covenants and manages a fourth in the Gabriola Island Trust Area.

One of the responsibilities of a covenant holder is to make sure the intent of the covenant is upheld over time. At minimum, GaLTT volunteers monitor each covenant property annually, usually with conservation partners. This work typically occurs behind the scenes and is an important part of GaLTT's conservation work.

Two monitoring visits were conducted week of May 30 to June 6 - one at S'ul-hween X'pey Nature Reserve and the other at Link Island Nature Reserve. Access is restricted on Link Island and the entire 53-acres is protected in perpetuity due to the generosity of the Swift family, who donated Link Lsland donated Link Island to the Islands Trust Conservancy in 2022. GaLTT and the Nanaimo Area Land Trust ("NALT") are the co-covenant holders who are responsible for ensuring the ecological values of the island are protected.

GaLTT Nature Stewards Program:

83 Nature Stewards participants confirmed in the program with pledges covering over 155 acres.

RDN Watershed Grant – Nature Steward Program Coordinator and Professional Biologist (Aquaparian) continue preparing prescribed plans for creek rehabilitation and community outreach plans.
